Meeting Summary January 6, 2023

Introduction

Wisconsin Chapter President Mike Yuhás was working from our in-person meeting site at the North Shore Congregational Church in Fox Point tonight. He greeted everyone at 7:28 pm. He started recording on Zoom, and started the meeting at 7:29 pm. There were then 35 devices connected to the Zoom virtual meeting room, and 18 people in the physical meeting room in the church basement.

Announcements

National President Tony White gave a short summary of the Rail Camp that we offer to rail-interested teen agers. The last Rail Camps were in 2019 before the corona virus pandemic. The program has a 25-year history, in partnership with Amtrak and various other railroad companies and railroad museums. We will re-start it in 2023. We hope to host 24 campers at Rail Camp East, in Newark, Delaware, from June 18 - June 24. We will offer 12 spaces at Rail Camp West in Tacoma, Washington, from July 23- July 30. Campers can be age 14-18. They will have an opportunity to spend a week exploring a wide variety of railroad interests. These include possible railroad careers. We are also looking for adults to serve as camp counselors. Counselors should ideally be people with extensive railroad backgrounds / experience, who are comfortable working with teen agers. Camp counselor candidates must be willing to submit to FBI background checks, and other checks as required. Chapter President Mike Yuhás added that our Chapter is looking to sponsor a local Rail Camper. Members should be looking for candidates. The above age limits are not flexible. We will have our second monthly informal on-line Railroad Gab Fest of the 2022-23 membership year at 7:30 pm on Friday, January 13, 2023. These are normally held on the second Friday of each month that we have a regular meeting (every month but July and August). President Yuhás will send an e-mail with more details to all members.

The annual business meeting and election of Chapter Officers will be on Friday, February 3, 2023. This will be a hybrid meeting, at both the usual in-person site (North Shore Congregational Church at 7330 North Santa Monica Boulevard in Fox Point, Wisconsin) and on-line via Zoom. We are still looking for a new Chapter President. Mike Yuhas is stepping down after four years of service (2019-2022). As is usual (no change in the rules), only full members of both NRHS National and the Wisconsin Chapter can run for (and vote for) officer or director positions. Paul Swanson will present selected photographs from the collection of the Lake States Railway Historical Association in Baraboo, Wisconsin. He plans to prominently (maybe exclusively) feature photos taken by our late Chapter member Harry Evans. Most of those date from the late 1950s through the 1960s. This should be a good show.

Our next regular bi-monthly on-line slide show will start at 7:30 pm on Tuesday, February 21, 2023. This event is on-line (via Zoom) only. We are looking for 4 or 5 presenters (about 15 minutes each) for that date. Anyone with good images to share should contact Mike Yuhas. Richard Koenig will present Midwest US railroad images from the late 1970s—just before the Staggers deregulation act—at the following monthly meeting on Friday, March 3, 2023. That meeting will also be hybrid—in-person at the church and on-line via Zoom.

All of these programs are supported / paid for by the members of the Wisconsin Chapter and (for Rail Camp) NRHS National. Members receive advance notice of these and similar events via e-mail. All of those who have not yet renewed their memberships for 2023 should do so now. Annual Wisconsin Chapter dues remain at \$20.00 per person. There has been no increase with the recent bout of inflation. There are three ways to renew (or join). The first is cash payment while attending a Chapter meeting in person. The second is on-line payment via our website at nrhswis.org. It includes a \$1.00 fee for PayPal processing costs. The third is to send a check to Wisconsin Chapter NRHS, P. O. Box 070758, Milwaukee, WI 53207. Dues payments support Chapter activities and publications. Your support is much appreciated.

NRHS National is also accepting online renewal payments for 2023. Those who did not renew online should by now have received a traditional paper invoice via US Mail. President Mike Yuhas took a photo of the in-person meeting attendees, primarily to obtain an accurate count of how many people attended in person.

Presentation

Long-time railroad photographer (over 55 years) and long-time Wisconsin Chapter member (over 50 years) Tom Hoffmann took over at 7:41 pm. Tom served as our Chapter Treasurer from July 1986 through January 2020. He has worked three days per week in charge of the Kalmbach Publishing Company library in Waukesha for the past 15 years. There were then 38 devices connected to Zoom.

Tom gave his annual "Twenty Years Ago" presentation, featuring images from 2002. He noted that the rate of change in railroading has really slowed down since he started giving these. He is considering going further back for his next similar presentation.

Zoom attendance peaked at 41 devices during the presentation. We had 18 attend in-person in the church basement. Two devices were at the church. Total peak attendance was therefore 57. A total of 43 remote attendees checked in during the meeting. Total attendance was therefore 59. The main part of the presentation ended at 8:35 pm. There was a short question and answer session.

Tom Hoffmann did it again: A great time was had by all at the January chapter meeting as Tom Hoffmann presented a look back at the railroading action he captured in 2002. Tom's "lookback" programs have been a regular chapter programming feature since 1987. The old adage says "the more things change, the more they stay the same" - and that's true in the case of these programs. Tom pointed out that on the face of it, railroading in 2002 was not that much different than railroading today, so he's thinking about flexing the concept for future shows. Perhaps the next look-back will turn back the dial 30 years? Stay tuned!

Some chapter business will be discussed, and annual elections will be held; an agenda will be posted at www.nrhswis.org prior to the meeting. Harry Evans photos from the Lake States Railway Historical Association collection

Paul Swanson, from the Lake States Railway Historical Association, will present notable photos from the Association's archive. Photography by the late Harry Evans (a longtime Wisconsin Chapter member) will be featured prominently.

Harry Evans (1943-2022) grew up in Winthrop Harbor, Illinois. With frequent rides on his bike to swim in Lake Michigan, he would stop at the railroad tracks to watch many locomotives pass by with trains. In short time, the C&NW became his favorite railroad. He was always interested in photography. As an eighth grade graduation present, his uncle gave him a used 35mm Voightlander camera. Thanks to an older brother, at the age of 14, his first railroad subject was a Nickel Plate double-header mainline steam freight roaring through Knox, Indiana in 1957. "It changed my life," he reflects. From that moment on he was hooked on trains and model railroading. He traveled with his brother in search of the last of steam in the Midwest, including capturing the last gasp of DM&IR during the steel strike in 1959, chasing the GTW in 1960, and western narrow gauge in 1961. His brother soon lost interest with the assimilation of diesels but Harry carried on documenting C&NW, MILW, CB&Q, EJ&E, the North Shore and many others on Kodachrome and Ektachrome film through his college years 1961-65 in Iowa. He continued on throughout the Midwest, expanding to Canada and Europe on occasion. During 1965-69 he worked in the Freight Traffic and Marketing Department at C&NW's 400 West Madison Street headquarters in Chicago. Harry returned to photography in the 1980s, eventually converting to all digital. In 2022, Harry selected Lake States Railway Historical Association to receive and preserve his life's work of railroad photography. LSRHA has scanned about 6,000 35mm slides concentrated on his pre-1990 era.

Founded in 2006, Lake States Railway Historical Association (LSRHA) is a 501(c)(3) Not-for-Profit climate-controlled secure archive storage and research facility located at Baraboo, Wisconsin. A membership-based organization, LSRHA maintains a collection of over 1 million photo images, 100,000 technical drawings, and numerous paper artifacts such as timetables, company and trade publications, track charts, equipment diagrams, Official Railway Guides and more. Over 85,000 photos and 500 drawings are available for viewing at their on-line photo archive. More information can be found at www.lsrha.org.

Museum's Famous Cat "Dirt" Passes Away

ELY, Nevada — Dirt, who became a celebrity in 15 years as the shop cat at the Nevada Northern Railway, has died, the railroad has announced on its Facebook page.

The orange and white male cat was adopted as a stray kitten by shop crews in 2008 and became famous for his coal-dust-tinted fur, photogenic nature, and regular appearance during shop tours and other special events. He has been featured in *Trains Magazine* and on *Trains.com* (most recently here), as well as in the *Washington Post* and elsewhere. His popularity inspired a line of products in Nevada Northern's online store ranging from T-shirts to Christmas ornaments to plush animals to coffee.

"We are all saddened with the passing of Dirt," the railroad wrote in its Facebook post. "He will be missed. The machine shop and engine house won't feel the same without him." Dirt will be buried near the railroad's depot, the railroad said, with a life-sized bronze casting serving as a gravestone. A second casting will be placed in the railroad's machine shop "so he can continue watching over the shop."

From the Archives

February 1958 - 65 Years Ago

Railroading at Christmas — Jim Scribbins, Milwaukee Road: Train 5, the Morning Hiawatha, carried three RPO working mail cars for the seasonal rush. Two sections of the Olympian Hiawatha were operated from December 18 to January 6. Because of the City of Denver is now carrying a Super Dome, the Minneapolis section of Train 16 and Train 5 used tap-cafe cars....C&NW still maintained its Christmas tradition of hanging a Christmas wreath in every window of the dining car and the parlor-observation car of the Twin Cities 400.

February 1963 - 60 Years Ago

Library donations are very warming this month. Dick Vogt has given the Chapter a copy of the 1947 "Locomotive Cyclopeda" for which we are grateful. An anonymous gentleman, again, a good member, has donated "The Nickel Plate Road," "The Road of the Century," "Steelways of New England," and two railroad photo albums. Thank you, Mr. Anonymous!

February 1968 - 55 Years Ago

The merger of the Pennsylvania and New York Central received final OK this month, over seven years after it was initiated. The giant system will operate over 5,000 diesel and electric locos, roughly 20% of the entire U.S. total....In view of the petition by the Milwaukee Road to discontinue the Copper Country Limited, Jim Scribbins researched a five page chronology of all of the operational and equipment changes from the inauguration of service in September, 1895 through April, 1964....C&NW has ordered another 20 bi-level coaches for the expanding Chicago suburban traffic....The Milwaukee Road will operate a ski train to Iron Mountain on February 23.

February 1973 - 50 Years Ago

Jon Nondahl contributed a comprehensive summary of Milwaukee Road motive power activity for 1972....Mike Iczkowski recounted a cab ride on the Southern Crescent.

February 1978 - 45 Years Ago

Over 450 freight cars are now parked at St. Ignace, Michigan, waiting to be ferried to the Lower Peninsula. This massive tieup has been caused by the success of the Michigan Northern Railroad. The Michigan DOT is considering running the aging car ferry Chief Wawatam on a twice-a-day schedule rather than its current once a week crossing....A recent blizzard tied up two C&NW freights, one at West Bend in a drift up to its headlight and another at Friesland, on the Adams line, up to the handrails. A big V plow was dispatched from Butler to rescue the trains. The plow is mounted on a gondola full of rocks, followed by two gons of scrap iron pushed by an SD45 and an SD40.

February 1983 - 40 Years Ago

The Milwaukee Road North Milwaukee depot at Hampton Avenue was demolished recently....Richard B. Ogilvie, trustee of the Milwaukee Road is seeking court authority to settle all undisputed tax claims at 90% of the principal amount

February 1988 - 35 Years Ago

President Dorothy Wiener proposed the establishment of a video library, to consist primarily of video transfers of railroad motion pictures shot over the years by railfans.

February 1993 - 30 Years Ago

The acquisition of the GB&W and FRV by the WC has been put on hold for 30 days but a number of track rearrangements in the Oshkosh area have already been made in anticipation of the take-over....The 1993 Snow Train is set to operate on February 19, 20, and 21 at North Freedom. However, both of the museum's snow plows are in bad order so, if ex-C&NW No. 1385 is unable to negotiate the line, a front end loader will be used to clear the track.

February 1998 - 25 Years Ago

Three railroads, WC, UP, and BNSF, are asking a federal court to overturn the new Wisconsin law requiring two-person crews on all trains operating in the state....The old yard office at the UP Butler Yard will soon be history. Yard office operations will move to the former division headquarters building....UP has filed to abandon the last 1.4 miles of track into Waukesha.

February 2003 - 20 Years Ago

Several articles covered various aspects of the proposed commuter rail line between Kenosha and Milwaukee....CN offered 30 jobs at its former IC Woodcrest Shop in Homewood, Illinois, to mechanical department employees displaced by the closing of the Stevens Point and North Fond du Lac shops. The shop closing affected 54 employees....Amtrak President David Gunn said Amtrak would require at least \$10 billion in federal subsidies over the next five years to keep its trains and infrastructure intact

February 2008 - 15 Years Ago

WSOR Revised Operations Plan included different abbreviations depending on where and when a train runs. Example HJ (Horicon-Janesville) JH (Janesville to Horicon) HM (Horicon to Milwaukee) and HMR (Horicon to Milwaukee Relief). For the 33rd Year Mid Continent Railway Museum is running a Snow Train Feb 15-17, 2008. All the trains are diesel powered due to the steam engines being out of service. Jim Wrinn Editor of TRAINS magazine is scheduled to present at Feb 8th meeting of the Chapter.

February 2013 - 10 Years Ago

An organization is proposing to restore Milwaukee Road 4-8-4 No. 265 and build a roundhouse museum to house the locomotive in Milwaukee's Menomonee Valley, once the home of the sprawling Milwaukee Shops. Nancy Ring, project manager for the Steam Marketing Group, said her for-profit organization is hoping to return No. 265, nicknamed "Old Smoky" to Milwaukee, where it was displayed from 1957 to 1975. It is now at the Illinois Railway Museum in Union, Ill., and was donated to the museum by the city of Milwaukee after road construction displaced the locomotive. Ring said the group wants to restore No. 265 to operating condition to pull trips around the state of Wisconsin. In addition to returning No. 265 to the city, Ring said the group wants to build a Milwaukee Road history museum in Milwaukee. The museum would replicate one of the two round-houses that once stood in the Milwaukee Shops complex. The history museum would be on a second floor of the roundhouse, with a walking tour telling the history of the Milwaukee Road system.

February 2018 — 5 Years Ago

Jerry Krug reported that the last two remaining CNW painted Dash9-44CW's locomotives have been repainted into Union Pacific colors. The reason given was due to the worsening condition of the 22 year old and a desire for a unified corporate image. They were the Dynamic Duo CNW #8701 and #8646.
